If you can't attend our Dia de los Muertos celebration at Anaheim Cemetery on Saturday, you can still enjoy some free Dia de los Muertos treats "To Go" the day before, on Friday, November 1<sup>st</sup>.

Just swing by Santa Ana Cemetery or El Toro Memorial Park at 3:00 p.m. on Friday, November 1<sup>st</sup>. Staff will have tables set up outside near each cemetery office building. While supplies last, staff will be handing out free small bouquets of marigolds, little bags of Pan de Muertos, and craft kits for children to enjoy that include a color your own skull mask, a coloring book, crayons, stickers, a scratch art kit, and a foam skeleton craft kit.

In past years, these items are distributed quickly, so be sure to arrive by 3 p.m. as supplies are limited.

Wreath ceremonies honoring our Veterans will be held on Saturday, December 14<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. at both El Toro Memorial Park and Santa Ana Cemetery. Volunteers hope to place a beautiful, fresh wreath on the grave of every Veteran in both cemeteries. But that can only happen if enough wreaths are sponsored.

El Toro's goal is to sponsor 1,200 wreaths. At last count, 893 wreaths have been secured and 307 wreaths still to be sponsored.

Santa Ana's goal is 850 wreaths. So far, 376 wreaths have been sponsored. Santa Ana Cemetery still needs 474 more wreaths to be sponsored.

## **Extended Visitation Hours at El Toro Memorial Park End November 3rd**

The end of Daylight Saving Time takes place on Sunday, Nov. 3<sup>rd</sup>. With the end of that additional daylight, also comes the end of extended visitation hours at El Toro Memorial Park. Beginning on Sunday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>, El Toro Memorial Park will close its gates at 5:00 p.m.

Please plan your visits accordingly so that you are leaving the park before 5:00 p.m. Please do not attempt to enter the park minutes before closing. ## Santa Ana Cemetery to Open 540 New Casket Interment Spaces in 2025

busy removing asphalt and base from three cemetery roads to create new interment spaces.

Currently, only about 500 casket spaces remain at El Toro Memorial Park. These could be sold out in April of 2026. The Santa Ana project will produce 540 casket interment and 220 spaces spaces. Like El Toro, these doubledepth casket spaces will only be sold to families in immediate need of burial, and only one space will be


Santa Ana Cemetery staff has been sold to each family in need. These spaces should be available for sale in January 2025. As part of the remaining development, staff will remove the remaining asphalt, import topsoil, grade and level each section, install new concrete curbs and lot pins, develop new mapping, and modify existing irrigation.

> cremation Since there is an urgent need for these spaces, no grass will be placed prior to sale and use. The area will be nicely graded and prepped for grass. Staff will open a

few sections at a time. When a majority of the spaces have been used for interments, staff will lav fresh sod over the entire section. When sod is placed, please do not leave flowers or gather in the area for at least two weeks so the sod can properly attach to the soil.

Marker installations will occur no sooner than three months after the date of interment. We greatly appreciate your understanding and cooperation in our preparation of your loved one's grave.

## Angel of Hope Candlelight Service, Friday December 6<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m.



There may be no worse trauma that a human being can experience, than the loss of a child. When the Angel of Hope monument was dedicated at El Toro Memorial Park in 2002, it was established with the hope that those struggling with such grief could find comfort in the angel's presence.

Since then, every year on Dec. 6th, families gather at the Angel of Hope at 7 p.m. to come together as a community, to share their grief, to encourage each other, and to express their love for these little lives lost too soon.

The program includes music, poetic readings, and special guest speakers. For many, the most profound moments of the service come when attendees are invited to come forward, speak their child's name, and place a white flower at the Angel's feet.

## **CEMETERY VISITATION HOURS**

Anaheim Cemetery Santa Ana Cemetery, and El Toro Memorial Park are open for visitation, seven days a week, from 8 am to 5 pm.

Cemetery Offices are open M-F, 8 am to 5 pm.

All offices are closed on the weekends and on holidays.

El Toro Memorial Park's Extended Visitation Hours will resume on April 9, 2025.

The Orange County Cemetery District provides affordable interment services for County residents and taxpayers. We strive to maintain the beauty and dignity of the grounds while preserving their historical and cultural value for the benefit of all.

#### Flower Removal and Holiday Schedule

Every Wednesday, groundskeepers remove and discard flowers and decorations throughout all three cemeteries. Families are encouraged to remove their flowers and/or decorations on Tuesday night. You can then place the flowers back on the space on Thursday morning. Please remember that the District policy only allows for two items to be placed on gravesites. This includes the in-ground flower vase and one other item. If gravesites exceed the number of allowed items, staff may remove and discard the excess items. Please do not leave items of great monetary or sentimental value on gravesites as the District cannot prevent theft.

Throughout the year, various holidays are recognized with extended periods between full park clean-ups. During these times, we ask that you empty the vase and place fresh water in the container every four to five days to eliminate mosquito breeding sources, which can cause serious health issues. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

In honor of Halloween and Dia de los Muertos, flowers may be placed on Thursday, October 17<sup>th</sup> and must be removed by Tuesday, Nov. 12<sup>th</sup>. Flowers may be placed for Thanksgiving and the December holiday season, beginning on Thursday, Nov. 21<sup>st</sup> and must be removed by Tuesday, January 7<sup>th</sup>. During this time, light clean-ups will still occur each Wednesday and only flowers that are obviously wilted will be removed.

During full park clean-ups everything on gravesites are discarded. Please be sure to remove items you do not want discarded before the cemetery closes on Tuesdays.
